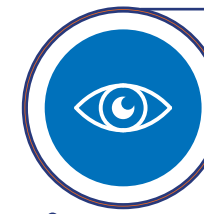

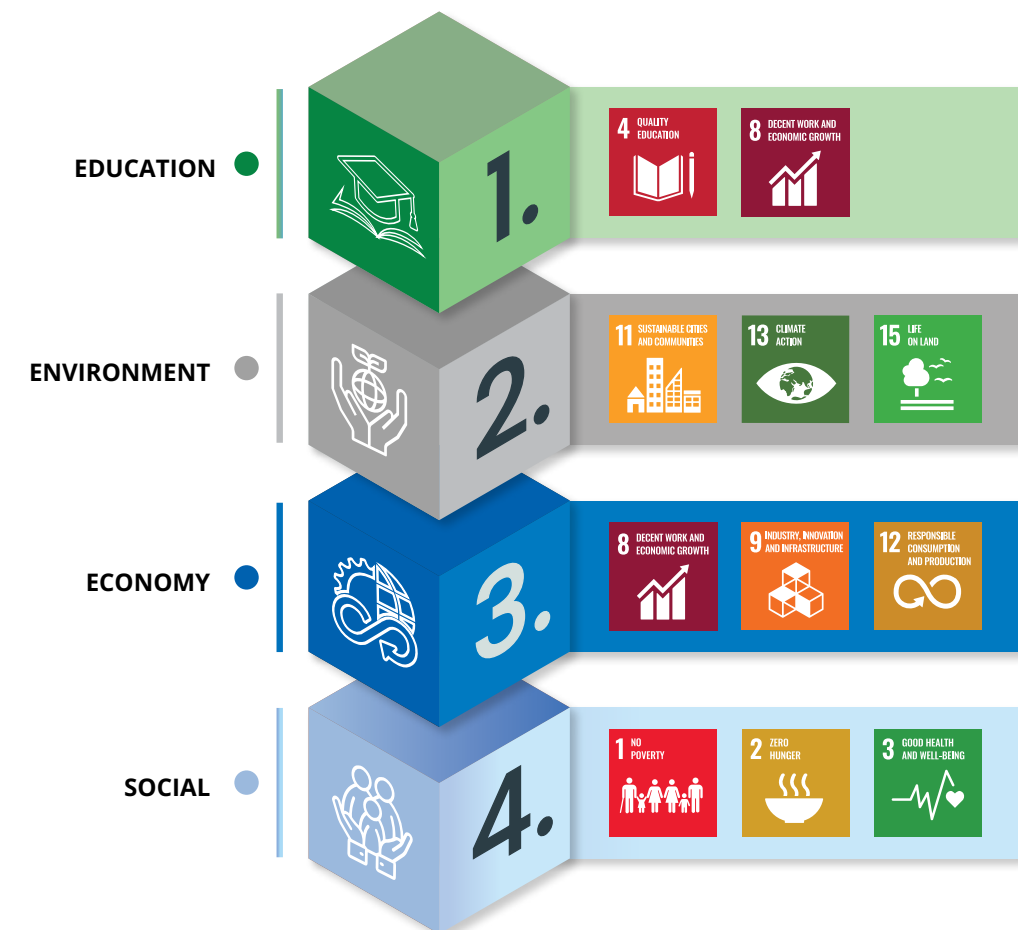

January



Expansion of the Partnership to Accelerate Stunting Reduction in Indonesia to 8 additional districts reaches 2,703 children under the age of two, strengthening efforts to combat stunting in Indonesia.

March



Inauguration of our 50 km Plastic Asphalt Road program in Garut, marking the longest stretch of plastic road in Indonesia, commemorating National Waste Awareness Day.

June



Bakti Barito Foundation hosts the Annual Barito Pacific Scholarship Ceremony in Jakarta, awarding 51 exceptional students and integrating career opportunities with education.

July

September



Climate Impact Innovations Challenge at the Indonesia International Sustainability Forum 2024 supports groundbreaking climate solutions, with Bakti Barito Foundation awarding a special prize to DayaTani for sustainable agriculture innovation.

October



Joint launch with KitaBisa and Happy Hearts Indonesia to renovate two earthquake-damaged schools in Garut, focusing on creating safe, earthquake-resilient learning environments for 220 students.

October



Launch of the Bakti Barito Learning Series, part of the Green Guardians program, educating over 1,000 people on environmental issues through webinars and workshops, in collaboration with local education departments.

Site visit to East Nusa Tenggara with STIR Education to bolster education systems through intrinsic motivation of teachers.

November

Strengthening climate literacy and resilience across Indonesia remains the cornerstone of Bakti Barito's collaborative efforts to ensure equitable access to climate education throughout the country.

Indonesia's commitment to fostering environmental awareness in schools has yielded significant progress, with the number of schools receiving the Adiwiyata Award rising from just 10 in 2007 to 28,270 by the end of 2023. These awards recognize schools that successfully implement the Environmental Care and Culture Movement in Schools (GPBLHS), promoting sustainable behaviors among students and improving the quality of school environments.

In 2024, Bakti Barito provided targeted support to schools aiming to achieve Adiwiyata accreditation, aligning with Regulation No. 52 of 2019 issued by the Ministry of Environment and Forestry. This support included 12 hours of assistance per school per week to enhance waste management systems, promote sustainable practices, and engage local communities in environmental stewardship.

A University of Indonesia study revealed significant improvements in climate literacy and sustainable practices in schools supported by Bakti Barito's philanthropic interventions, demonstrating the program's transformative impact.

The Green Guardians program significantly expanded its reach in 2024, extending support to 31 schools. This included the training of 810 teachers and school leaders in environmental education and sustainable practices. The program also facilitated the management of 15.1 tons of waste from 2022, benefiting over 26,000 students and their communities by promoting recycling and generating supplementary income.

Teacher training emerged as a key priority, particularly in response to 2021 UNESCO findings indicating that less than 40% of educators lack confidence in teaching climate-related topics. To address this gap, the Bakti Barito Learning Series was launched, focusing on capacity building for educators. In its first year, the series engaged over 400 teachers, equipping them with tools and strategies to integrate environmental education into their curricula effectively.

Teacher training emerged as a key priority, particularly in response to 2021 UNESCO findings indicating that less than 40% of educators lack confidence in teaching climate-related topics.

Impact Analysis Study of Environmental Care and Culture Movement in Schools

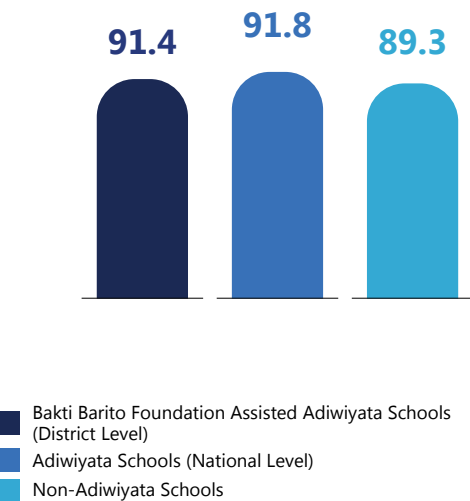
A study by the University of Indonesia and Bakti Barito Foundation highlights the transformative impact of targeted support in environmental education. Comparing national Adiwiyata, Bakti Barito-supported, and non-Adiwiyata schools, the research underscores the success of the Green Guardians program in improving sustainability practices and fostering community impact.

Rebuilding Brighter Futures

Bakti Barito Foundation, Kitabisa, and Happy Hearts Indonesia have successfully rebuilt two schools in Garut, providing students with safe, earthquake-resistant classrooms in just three months. Using 9.4 tons of recycled plastic bricks, this initiative not only ensures a secure learning environment but also contributes to sustainability by preventing an estimated 22 tons of carbon emissions.

Bakti Barito Learning Series

Partnership to Accelerate Stunting Reduction in Indonesia (PASTI)

Indonesia has made remarkable progress in reducing childhood stunting, lowering the prevalence from 37.2% in 2013 to 21.5% in 2023. Despite this success, significant challenges remain in achieving the national target of 10% by 2030. Variations in stunting rates across districts, inadequate family support for proper feeding practices, and gaps in the capacity of community health volunteers continue to hinder progress.

To address these challenges, the Partnership to Accelerate Stunting Reduction in Indonesia (PASTI) was launched in 2023 by the Ministry of National Population Planning in collaboration with USAID, Tanoto Foundation, Amman Mineral Nusa Tenggara, Bank Central Asia, and Bakti Barito Foundation implemented by Wahana Visi Indonesia. This four-year initiative operates in four provinces—Banten, East Java, West Kalimantan, and East Nusa Tenggara.

In 2024, PASTI significantly expanded its outreach to 16 districts (up from 8 in 2023). This involved training close to 6,800 community health volunteers. The establishment of 387 community-based nutrition rehabilitation centers (Pos Gizi) reached 2,747 children under the age of two, of whom 63% achieved the target weight gain of 200 grams after intervention.

STIR Education

Strengthening teacher motivation and fostering collaboration in schools remain at the core of Bakti Barito Foundation's partnership with STIR Education. Since 2022, this initiative has worked to cultivate a culture of professional learning and intrinsic motivation among educators to improve student learning outcomes in Indonesia.

In 2024, Bakti Barito's partnership with STIR Education significantly expanded its reach to 6 districts (up from two in 2023). This included the training of 19,855 teachers, principals, and school supervisors in gaining new leadership and pedagogical strategies while building collaborative learning communities to address classroom challenges collectively. The program also benefited 389,950 students across 2,565 schools.

The partnership demonstrated encouraging results, particularly in Kota Kediri, East Java. A survey conducted in January found that 90% of school leaders observed significant improvements in teachers' ability to create engaging and enjoyable learning environments. Educators reported increased student enthusiasm for learning and improved peer collaboration in classrooms.

Barito Pacific Scholarship

In 2024, building on our long-standing commitment to education, we expanded the Barito Pacific Scholarship Program by integrating contributions from Barito Pacific Group's subsidiaries—Chandra Asri Group, Barito Renewables, and Petrindo Jaya Kreasi. Previously solely funded by Barito Pacific, we embraced group contributions in 2024, with a commitment of Rp 2.5 billion over two years starting next year, further reinforcing our pledge to invest in our employees' families.

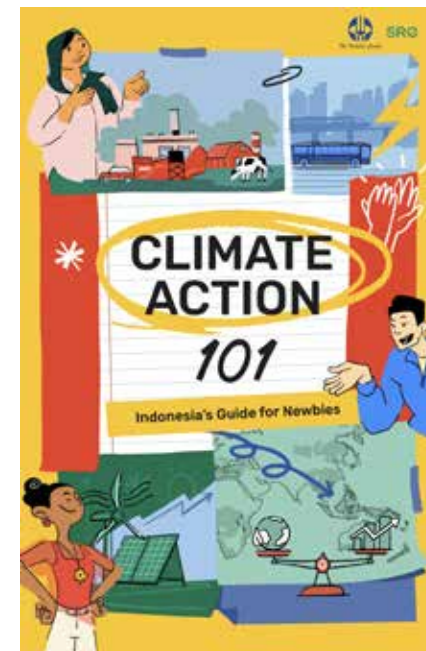

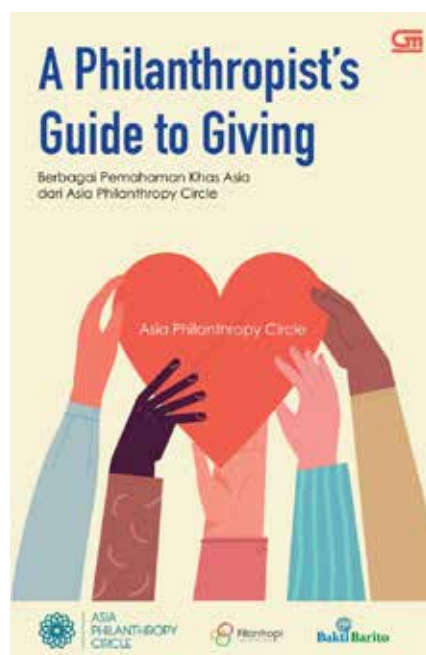
Climate Action 101: Indonesia's Guide for Newbies

Monitoring and Evaluation

Bakti Barito Foundation embodies the philanthropic spirit of Barito Pacific Group, encompassing the company's foundation, corporate social responsibility initiatives, and personal philanthropy of its founder, Prajogo Pangestu.

As the central hub for consolidating and monitoring the CSR efforts across the group, Bakti Barito Foundation oversees initiatives from Barito Pacific Group and its diverse subsidiaries, including Chandra Asri Group, Barito Renewables (a sub-holding company for Star Energy Geothermals), Griya Idola, Petrindo Jaya Kreasi, and more.

Through a rigorous evaluation framework, the foundation ensures that each program not only meets its social and environmental objectives but also contributes to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) within its operational areas—reinforcing our collective commitment to creating lasting impact across Indonesia.

Plastic Asphalt Road for Indonesia Asri

In 2024, Chandra Asri Group achieved a major milestone by completing 120.8 kilometers of plastic asphalt roads—transforming 1,086 tons of low-value plastic waste on Java Island into durable, sustainable infrastructure. Building on this success, an extensive evaluation study covering 23 road sections along a 50-kilometer stretch on the Garut road confirmed that plastic asphalt boosts road durability by up to 40% while reducing long-term maintenance costs, enabling governments to redirect funds to other vital development needs.

In June, Chandra Asri Group further showcased its innovative solution by launching the National Plastic Asphalt Showcase in Bali, in partnership with the ASEAN Center of Excellence on Smart City (ASECH)

and Jimbaran Hijau. This dynamic event served as a learning center where city and district governments from across Indonesia could observe the practical application of plastic asphalt—demonstrating how low-value plastic waste can be effectively utilized in road construction.

Chandra Asri Group has actively engaged in policy advocacy to promote the widespread adoption of plastic asphalt across the nation. By collaborating with government bodies and industry associations, the company is championing sustainable practices that not only alleviate environmental burdens but also generate new job opportunities in waste processing and infrastructure sectors.

SAGARA: Innovation Prevents Waste Leaking Into the Sea

The SAGARA program prevents waste leakage into the sea by empowering coastal communities in Anyer Village to implement onshore waste management practices based on circular economy concepts.

Through education efforts and assistance by the SAGARA program, the Community Self-Help Group (KSM) established a Waste Bank and Temporary Waste Shelter to manage waste in Anyar Village, which was previously underserved by waste transportation facilities.

Both high-value plastic waste, such as PET bottles, HDPE containers, and other plastics, and low-value plastic waste are sent to IPST ASARI, an integrated waste management center initiated by Chandra Asri Group. At IPST ASARI, high-value plastic waste is sold directly to recycling centers, while low-value plastic

waste is transformed into pyrolysis oil (under Chandra Asri’s brand PLUSRI®). This pyrolysis oil, which serves as an alternative fuel akin to diesel, kerosene, and gasoline, is then redistributed for reuse within the community and by fishermen—thereby closing the loop.

In 2024, SAGARA, which was carried out in Desa Anyar, successfully managed 23,625 kilograms of waste, with 18% of it being plastic waste.

End-to-End Plastic Waste Management: IPST ASARI

IPST ASARI is an integrated waste management center designed to process low-value plastic waste into pyrolysis oil, which is an alternative fuel similar to diesel.

Serving not only as a waste management center but also as an educational hub for students, academics, and the public, IPST ASARI has welcomed visits from prominent stakeholders, such as the Presidential Secretariat, Ministry of Industry, and City and District Governments, for focused discussions on plastic waste management.

Thanks to Chandra Asri Group’s education efforts, residents are incentivized to exchange their plastic waste for PLUSRI® at IPST ASARI. In 2024, IPST ASARI managed 17.5 tons of plastic waste, involving 7,882 residents in waste segregation.

This effort converted 8.3 tons of low-value plastic waste into 6,215 liters of pyrolysis oil, all of which were used to benefit local residents and SMEs.

Activities Led by Barito Renewables

Java-Wide Leopard Survey

In July, Barito Renewables launched a two-year collaboration worth Rp 2.2 billion with Sintas Indonesia Foundation as part of the national Java-Wide Leopard Survey (JWLS) to protect the critically endangered Javan leopard (*Panthera pardus melas*) in Mount Halimun Salak National Park. By actively collecting and analyzing genetic data, this project is set to enhance the species’ population resilience and bolster government wildlife management programs.

Mount Halimun Salak National Park stands as a vital biodiversity hotspot, yet the future of the Javan leopard remains uncertain—fewer than 9% of Java’s landscapes remain suitable for this iconic predator. Star Energy Geothermal Salak, a subsidiary of Barito Renewables, operates within a 400-square-kilometer conservation area in the park, using less than 2% of its land. This sustainable cohabitation underscores how renewable energy development can coexist with—and even amplify—biodiversity conservation.

Early conservation efforts increased the Javan leopard population by 30% between 2008 and 2014, although the species remains critically endangered. By mapping genetic diversity as a key component of JWLS, Barito Renewables and Sintas Indonesia will drive data-driven conservation strategies that align with national priorities set by the Ministry of Environment and Forestry (KLHK). The project’s findings will be disseminated through international scientific journals, advancing global conservation efforts while contributing to broader climate action and the Sustainable Development Goals.

This event was part of The 10th Indonesia International Geothermal Convention & Exhibition (IIGCE) 2024, where SEG served as the committee chair and hosted field visits. Over the past 11 years, SEG and BTNGHS have released nine eagles, demonstrating a sustained commitment to wildlife conservation.

Barito Renewables, operating through Star Energy Geothermal, has embedded biodiversity conservation into the very heart of its operations. In ecologically sensitive areas like Mount Halimun Salak, Wayang Windu, and Darajat, the company takes proactive measures to protect native flora and fauna, ensuring that their operations promote ecological balance.

Black Soldier Fly Waste Management

Championing circular sustainability, Griya Idola—through its subsidiary Mambruk Hotel & Convention—continues to operate its groundbreaking Black Soldier Fly (BSF) Waste Management Program. This initiative transforms organic waste into nutrient-rich compost and liquid fertilizer, keeping food scraps out of landfills and enriching local soils.

Harnessing the remarkable power of BSF larvae to process food scraps and kitchen waste, Mambruk Hotel & Convention achieves 100% organic waste recycling. The program not only diverts waste but also produces valuable byproducts that local farmers repurpose to boost crop yields. Moreover, the larvae serve as a high-protein feed source for local livestock, creating a dynamic circular system that benefits both the environment and the community.

As of 2024, the BSF program has processed 10,575 kg of organic waste, yielding 174 kg of compost and 500 kg of high-protein feed. Through this innovative approach, Griya Idola sets a compelling example of how creative waste management can drive sustainability and support thriving local ecosystems.

Activities Led by Petrindo Jaya Kreasi



Transform Waste with Economic Value

Every year, vast amounts of waste challenge the health of our natural landscapes and communities. In response, Petrindo Jaya Kreasi, the holding company behind Petrosea, has launched “Transform Waste with Economic Value” (*Ubah Limbah Bernilai Ekonomis*). This transformative initiative reimagines waste as a valuable resource by integrating circular economy principles into community waste management.

Partnering with the Balikpapan Main Waste Bank and the community group KUBE Srikandi Bersatu in Kariangau Village, the initiative empowers residents with targeted education and hands-on training to effectively separate and process waste. In 2024, this community-driven model not only diverted 2.8 tons of organic waste, 8.8 tons of inorganic waste, and 33.3 tons of residual waste into productive recycling streams but also delivered tangible economic benefits. Revenue collected from waste increased to Rp 13.8 million in 2024—up 45% from Rp 9.5 million in 2023—demonstrating the growing economic viability of the program. With 22 participating households, the Waste Bank enabled residents to exchange sorted waste for value, generating an average monthly transaction of Rp 1.1 million.

Mangrove Conservation and Preservation

Across Indonesia’s dynamic coastal landscapes, mangroves play a crucial role in shielding shorelines, nurturing marine life, and sustaining local livelihoods. Petrosea’s commitment to environmental stewardship is powerfully embodied in its Mangrove Conservation and Preservation program. This initiative, conducted in close collaboration with the Department of Environment Sorong and local community groups like Tani Hutan “Lasianthera,” has transformed degraded coastal areas into thriving mangrove ecosystems.

Since May 2024, the program has galvanized community participation through Clean Up Days, tree planting events, and educational outreach that culminated in the planting of 1,000 mangrove trees. A highlight of the initiative was the celebration of World Mangrove Day 2024, during which 500 new mangrove seedlings were planted, underscoring the program’s dedication to ecological restoration. By ensuring that 70% of the planted mangroves remain healthy and resilient, the program not only bolsters biodiversity but also enhances coastal protection and fosters sustainable economic opportunities.
